March 1

A better covenant; Christ not the law.

Hebrews 8:6 'He is the Mediator of a better covenant,'

Our highest call is to be the representatives of our King.

May 19

March 24

Matthew 14:18 'He said, Bring them here to Me.'

He is able to do great things through weak and insignificant people.
If we are willing to give our life to Christ
then even the smallest task is important.
We must be diligent to develop and use the abilities we have;

March 25

Sacrificial love reaching out to others.

1 John 3;14 'We know that we have passed from death unto life, because we love the brethren. He that loves not his brother abides in death.'

March 26

Mark 9:40 'For he that is not against us is on our part.'

March 27

Presenting the gospel with meekness and fear.

1 Peter 3:15 \...be ready always to give an answer to everyone who asks you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear:'

Meekness does not present the gospel in a condescending manner; it seeks to lift others with the love of Christ.

The manner in which we present Christ is just as important as the words we speak.

Fear is not the dread of punishment; it means being careful in the things we say and do; treating people with respect; and being aware at all times that we serve the living God.

When people see the love of Christ in us then we will be given opportunities to share the message of the gospel with them.

March 28

His mercy does not depend upon us.

Lamentations 3:22 'It is of the LORD'S mercies that we are not consumed, because His compassions fail not.'

We can depend upon His mercy because His mercy does not depend upon us. He shows compassion towards us because of His character not ours.
Religion has no power to bring new life;
our works can never earn salvation;
and righteous acts cannot wipe away one sin.
The goodness of God and His great love towards us
are found in Jesus Christ alone.
There is no sin His blood cannot cleanse;
no habit His power in us cannot overcome;
no difficulty He will not bring us through;
and there is no person He is not willing to save.

March 29

Maturity; experience; knowledge of the word; relationship.

1 John 2:13 'I write unto you, fathers, because you have known Him who is from the beginning'.

The need of the Church is for fathers; not a profession or a title held by religious leaders, but people who know the Lord in intimate relationship. People who care for the welfare of others; known for their maturity in Christ; having a lifetime of experience through walking daily with the Lord; filled with the word of God and knowing that He is able to do what He has promised; ready always to pray for others; and having such a close relationship with Jesus that they only have one desire, to know Him more.

March 30

The royal law of love

James 2:8 'If you fulfil the royal law according to the scripture, You shall love your neighbour as yourself, you do well:'

There is no greater law than the royal law of love. It is called the royal law because it expresses the heart of the King; and brings joy to those the King wishes to bless. It is not an emotional response to the need of others; it is love rooted in Christ. It is love that flows out of the joy of knowing who we are in Christ; love that acts because we are the children of the King. We love others as we love ourselves;

and we love ourselves because it is Christ who dwells in us.
